  - Begin with the End in Mind Encourage your child to set clear learning Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound (SMART) goals for each subject and visualise their desired outcomes.


- Put First Things First Help your child prioritise across the learning topics, manage their time well, and avoid last-minute cramming.

  - Study and Play: Ensure your child/ward has dedicated time for both studying and relaxing with their favourite activities.

  - Open Conversations: Create a safe space for your child/ward to talk about their feelings and any worries they might have. Simply listening can make a huge difference.

## **Key Highlights for Term 4**

#### **Student Absence Notification on Parents Gateway**

Since the rollout of "Student Absence" feature on Parents Gateway (PG) in Term 3, it has been more convenient for parents to indicate your child's reason for absence(s) and submit the medical certificates and official documents.



We are pleased to share that this feature will be further enhanced in Term 4. With effect from Monday, 15 September 2025, parents will receive PG push notification when your child is marked absent from school. The image appended is an example of a "Student Absence Notification".

Parents can follow the instructions on the notification and complete the steps to submit the reason and valid documents. The school does not accept more than 2 parents' letters per term. All submissions for the year

are recorded in the app until 30 June of the following year. This allows for easy reference. More details about the enhancement and a user guide for parents can be found in the attachment of this PG post. For clarifications, please approach your child's Form Teacher(s).

## Home-Based Learning Day(s) for P3, P4 and P5 Students on 25, 26 and 29 September Respectively

During the period of PSLE written examinations, Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days will be organised for our P3, P4 and P5 students on 25 (Thu), 26 (Fri) and 29 (Mon) September respectively. Through meaningfully designed lessons and tasks by our teachers, we would want to provide opportunities for our students to learn from and beyond the curriculum, apply the knowledge and skills that they have acquired and progressively build their emerging 21st Century Competencies and dispositions to develop them to become independent and lifelong learners. This will also be a good opportunity for our students to leverage technology for their self-directed revision ahead of their year-end examinations.

The assignments will be shared with your child/ward through the Student Learning Space (SLS) portal on the morning of the HBL days to help students pace their work and simulate readiness for full HBL in more challenging times. **P3**, **P4** and **P5** students need not report to school on their respective HBL day. The SLS guide for parents' reference is available on our school website should your child face any technical issues on that day. More details about HBL will be furnished in a separate PG announcement.

# <u>Supplementary Lessons for P3 to P5 Students during PSLE Marking Exercise (Monand Tues, 13 and 14 October)</u>

As our school is no longer designated as a PSLE Marking Centre, we are able to deploy some of our teachers to prioritise and provide the additional learning support for **all our P3 to P5 students through supplementary lessons conducted on 13 and 14 October (Mon & Tues) 2025**. These lessons are planned to help our students reinforce their acquisition of conceptual skills and mastery of content as they further prepare for the year-end weighted assessments. As a number of our teachers will also be deployed for PSLE marking during that period, we are not able to provide similar lessons for P1, P2 and P6 students during those days.

More details will be shared with you as we work out the logistical and administrative details. Kindly note that all <u>P3 to P5 students are required</u> to attend school only on <u>13 and 14 October (Mon & Tues)</u>, with curtailed curriculum time, tentatively planned from 7.45 am to 11.30 am. All P3 to P5 students do <u>not</u> have to report to school on 16 October (Wed).

Please note that all P1, P2 and P6 students need <u>not</u> report to school from 13 to 15 October (Mon to Wed).

#### Children's Day 2025 Celebration

The school will be celebrating Children's Day on **2 October 2025 (Thur)** with the theme "Playtastic". Yuhualites can look forward to sports and games, class bonding, and exciting recess activities and small bites such as popcorn, ice cream, and game booths. School hours will be from **7.45 am to 11.00 am**, with adjusted recess times to allow every student time to enjoy the celebrations.

## P5 Sports Exposure Programme - Fencing

P5 students will have the exciting opportunity to learn, appreciate, and enjoy fencing as part of a sports exposure programme designed to build confidence, resilience, and focus. The programme will be conducted by certified fencing trainers on **29**, **30 and 31 October** (**Wed to Fri) after curriculum time**. Students will be informed of their allocated groups, specific date and timings through PG at a later date.

## InnoMake Programme for P5 and P6 Students - A.I. and Digital Literacy

Focusing on A.I. and Digital Literacy, our schools' InnoMake Programme and IMDA's AI for Fun (AIFF), bring together learning experiences that enrich the hearts and minds of our students, preparing them to grow and thrive as Singapore builds its Smart Nation future.

Earlier this year in Term 1, our P5 students began their AI journey with AIFF Module A, where they learnt to use Generative AI safely and responsibly for ideation and content creation. In the coming term, they will take on InnoMake Master, where they deepen their understanding of AI while confidently applying the block-based programming skills gained in InnoMake Junior. Using the micro:bit and CreateAI, they will collect data and train basic machine learning models, which will then be embedded into AI-enabled prototypes. They will also apply Design Thinking as they create solutions that promote sustainable living, aligned with the national SG Green Plan 2030.

Learning does not stop after PSLE. Our P6 students will take part in InnoMake Champion, where they deepen their learning by designing and prototyping mobile apps while applying the block-based programming skills they have built up over the past three years through the InnoMake Programme. As part of the design process, they will apply Design Thinking to refine their ideas and learn to use AI tools responsibly for ideation and to generate text and images that support their app content. These apps will highlight CyberWellness and responsible digital citizenship, encouraging students to reflect on their own online habits and how technology can be used positively. They will also participate in AIFF Module B, where they will learn how smart robots respond to inputs via sensors and how computer vision can be integrated with robotics to solve problems.

Through these experiences, we grow the hearts and minds of Yuhualites, nurturing them as caring innovators, responsible digital citizens, and future-ready learners.

#### Assembly Talk on POSB Financial Literacy

The school will be hosting the "Save Smart with Smiley" financial literacy Assembly talk for all our students on 6 November 2025 (Thurs). This engaging session will help Yuhualites understand essential money management concepts through interactive activities and real-world examples.

During recess periods, students will also have the opportunity to participate in educational activities like the "Needs and Wants Board Game" and innovative Mixed Reality Experience. These activities are specially designed to teach fundamental financial concepts in an age-appropriate and engaging manner. POSB's beloved mascot, Smiley, will also be making a special appearance to meet our students on that day.

Through this programme, students will develop important skills in understanding needs versus wants, smart spending habits, and basic money management. We believe these foundational skills will help prepare our students for their financial future while making the learning process enjoyable and memorable.

### Cyber Bytes - Online Words Matter

Our Yuhualites do not always see how their online words affect others. In this short video, a boy chats in his game without realising his classmates feel hurt. With Mum's gentle talk, he learns that *online or offline, kindness counts.* 

Tip for parents: Chat with your child about thinking before typing. Ask: "How would I feel if someone said this to me?"
